Recipe: Hollandaise Sauce (Fanny Farmer)


 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter (one stick)

2 egg yolks

- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1/4 tsp. salt (optional)
- Few grains Cayenne pepper

Divide butter into three pieces. Place one piece in double boiler with egg yolks and lemon juice. Cook over boiling water, stirring constantly with wire whisk until butter melts. Add second piece of butter, and, as mixture thickens, the third piece. Remove from fire before third piece completely melts. Season. If mixture curdles, stir in two tablespoons heavy cream or boiling water, drop by drop.
