Gerald S. 'Jerry' Park, 76

Gerald S. "Jerry" Park, 76, passed away peacefully at his Kalispell home on Aug. 12. 2013.

Jerry was born in Dallas, the son of Sidney And Erin (Cook) Park. He grew up in Dallas and graduated from Sunset High School. Jerry then attended Texas Christian University, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1961.

Jerry served honorably in the U.S. Army from 1961 to 1962, when he then became an armored officer in the Texas National Guard until 1969.

In the late 1950s and early 1960s, Jerry was involved in radio broadcasting. Susie used to dance in the headlights at the TCU parking lot during "Jerry's Night Show" before she met him. In 1963, Jerry switched to television and worked for ABC Television as a newsman and anchor. He retired in 1999 in Oklahoma City, Okla., and was inducted in the Broadcasters Hall of Fame in 2008, for his many years of service.

Jerry was actively involved with United Cerebral Palsy, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and a member of the Southern Hills Christian Church. He enjoyed reading and traveling.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Sidney and Erin Park.

Jerry is survived by his wife of 49 years, Sharon "Susie" Park, of Kalispell; sons, Rusty Park of Kalispell, and Randy and Anne Park of Plainfield, Ill.; daughter, ShyAnn, and Grant Milner, of Edmond, Okla.; sisters, Kay Fikes, Nancy Malik and Betsy Hayes; brother-in-law, Larry Webb; five grandchildren Lauren, Ryan and Maggie Park, and Mason and Jacob Milner; and aunt, Jean Patton, of Dallas.

A celebration of life for Jerry will be held at 10 a.m. on Thursday, Aug. 15, at the Easthaven Baptist Church Foyer (near the fireside).

Jane's Excellent Adventure

I am dying to tell you all about Brock's and my trip to London and Paris! We were celebrating our 12th wedding anniversary. We departed the U.S. on Tuesday, September 24 and flew to London. London is about 7 hours ahead. We were pretty wiped out when we arrived, due to our long time on the plane and the time change. But we walked around the shopping district, checked out my new favorite department store, "Selfridges", which was simply amazing, had fish and chips at a pub, then thank goodness our room was ready! We took a long nap, got up, had dinner, crashed for the night, then we were good to go! We had a free day before our tour began, so we did lots of walking: Hyde Park, Buckingham Palace, Kensington Palace - I posed for photos in front of a magnificent gate; I realized later this is the gate where multitudes of flowers were left for Diana when she died! Our Tauck tour was comprised of forty interesting people from all over the United States. We had an excellent young female director, plus two informative local guides in each city. In London, we toured Windsor Castle, Westminster Abbey, the Tower of London, the London Eye, and the British Museum; saw a performance of "Matilda" in the theater district; and had high tea at Fortnum and Mason department store. We took the Eurostar train through the "chunnel" to Paris and had a bus tour of Paris that included a stop to photograph the Eiffel Tower and a drive along the Champs Elysee to see the Arc de Triomphe. In Paris we toured the Palace of Versailles, the Musee du Louvre, and the Notre Dame Cathedral; and Brock and I had our portraits done by artists working at Montmartre. The same bridges that we viewed on foot by day we traveled beneath at night when we enjoyed a farewell dinner cruise on the Seine River. The bridges are so beautiful when lit at night! Seeing the Eiffel Tower's sparkling lights at night was magical! We flew home on Thursday, October 3. The travel days were rough, but other than that discomfort, we had no jet lag at all. We had spectacular, cool weather the whole time - no rain at all. I loved every minute! We had some good meals; I'd say the best meal was at Maze Restaurant in London, which is run by Gordon Ramsay. Each place we went, we spent only a few hours and wished we could have spent at least a whole day there. The tour provided us with a wonderful introduction to both cities, perfect for us since this was our first time to visit. Of course we want to go back! I loved both cities, but I felt most comfortable in London because there was less visible poverty, there was so much history and so much to see there, and of course I understood the language better. However, the cost of living is so high in both cities, there is no way we could live there! The single place I enjoyed the most I would have to say was, surprising to me, the Louvre! The building itself was spectacular, a former palace, a blending of old and new, a work of art in itself; and the art work within was simply spectacular. We barely brushed the surface. Our local guides added so much to the experience. I felt so fortunate to be able to go on this trip. I am including a photo of me getting my portrait made in Paris at Montmartre.



Recipe: Chilled Lemon Souffles – from Karin Mikkelsen Utzinger of Bozeman

Vegetable oil or spray

1/4 cup water

1 tsp. unflavored gelatin

3 large eggs, separated

2 Tablespoons corn starch

1 cup + 2 Tablespoons whole milk

6 Tablespoons sugar, divided

6 Tablespoons fresh lemon juice

1-1/2 teaspoon lemon zest

- Lightly oil six soufflé dishes or ramekins
- Pour water into small bowl and add gelatin until softened (about 15 min.)

(B)

- · Whisk yolks and corn starch together
- $\bullet\,$ Combine milk + $1\!\!/_{\!2}$ the sugar in a saucepan stir until simmer
- Add about 1/3 milk mixture to yolks (gradually)
- Then add all yolks back to milk mixture
- Whisk constantly on high until it boils and thickens (about 2 min.)
- · Remove from heat and whisk 2 min. longer
- · Add in lemon juice and zest
- · Stir in gelatin mixture until it dissolves

- Whisk egg whites over a pot of simmering water until an insta-read thermometer reads 140 degrees F
- . Then transfer whites to a stand or hand mixer and beat until stiff peaks form
- Gently fold whites into lemon curd, let stand to cool 10 minutes
- · Divide among six soufflé dishes and refrigerate overnight
- To remove run a knife around the edge of the soufflé dishes (if this doesn't work you can half immerse them in hot water for 10-15 seconds).
- Set a plate on top of soufflé dish and quickly invert to free soufflé from mold Enjoy! Caramel sauce topping is recommended.
